Zadanie 1

Tekst 1

There was a great desire among explorers to be the first to reach the South Pole and raise their country's flag. Roald Amundsen, a Norwegian explorer, and Englishman Robert Falcon Scott led expeditions that set out at the same time. In 1910, Amundsen sailed for Antarctica, intending to be the first person to reach the South Pole. He set up a base camp at the Bay of Wales. Amundsen's expedition travelled by dog sleds and reached the South Pole on 14 December 1911. They raised the Norwegian flag. They arrived back at their base camp on 25 January 1912. They covered about 2,800 km in 99 days. Robert Scott set out for Antarctica on the ship Terra Nova. His expedition reached Ross Island and set off for the South Pole on dog sleds, ponies, and motorized vehicles on 1 November 1911. They left the motorised vehicles after a few days, as they were useless in the snow. The vehicles simply could not get through it. Scott's team reached the South Pole on 18 January 1912, to find Amundsen's Norwegian flag already flying there. Amundsen and Scott were both determined to beat each other to the Pole, so their efforts became known as the race to the South Pole.

Roald Amundsen became the first person to reach the South Pole. He was also the first to fly over the North Pole in an airship, and the first person to sail around the world through the Northeast and Northwest passages from the Atlantic to the Pacific in 1905. However, he was not the first person to reach the North Pole, but was the first to see both Poles.

Story 2

A tsunami is a series of waves caused by a sudden and fast movement of a big amount of water in an ocean. Earthquakes, volcanic eruptions and other underwater explosions (for example: detonations of nuclear bombs) can start a tsunami.

A tsunami is different from typical ocean waves because it is not the result of wind and sea tides. Normal sea waves are also the effect of the gravitational pull of the Moon and the Sun on oceans on Earth.

Wonder tells the story of Auggie, a ten-year-old boy. He lives with his parents and he is an ordinary boy in many ways. He rides a bike. He plays football after school. But Auggie looks very different from other kids. He was born with deformities of the face. At the start of the book, he tells us 'My name is Auggie. I won't describe what I look like. You will not like it.' Auggie's face shocks people and they usually look away when they see him.

Auggie has spent a lot of time in hospital. Up till now his mother has taught him at home. But now Auggie is ten and he must go to school. Auggie hates this idea. He does not want to learn with other children. He worries that they will laugh at him.

However, one day his parents take him to a local school. After this visit, Auggie decides that, yes, he will learn there. On the first day at school, Auggie feels really nervous. Because of his face, nobody wants to sit next to him or talk to him. Luckily, he makes friends with Jack, a boy in his class.

Wonder tells the story of Auggie's first school year. It is an interesting book. Both adults and teenagers can read it. It shows a child living in a world difficult for people who look different.
